First I bequeath my soule into the hands of the Almighty God, Hoping on through the Merits of Jesus Christ my Saviour to be made Partaker of Everlasting life, And I bequeath my Bodie to the Earth whereof it was made. Item I give to the Parson of the Parish of Inghen four Bushels of Wheat; Item I give unto William Hayes and Alice as his wife the Sonne and Daughter of my Kinswoman Mary Hayes wife of Richard Hayes to each of them forty Shillings of lawfull English money to be paid to them when Edmund Hunt their Grandfather and the Overseer of this my last Will shall thinke it fit to be paid. Item I give unto Mary Hayes my Kinswoman and wife of Richard Hayes five Pounds of lawfull English Money. Item I give and bequeath unto my Kinswomen Alice Hunt and Margaret Hunt and to each of them five Pounds of lawfull English money to be paid to them at or their Day of Marriage. Item I give and bequeath to Anne my Kinswoman five Pounds of lawfull English Money to be paid unto her when shee shall accomplish the Age of one and twentieth years or at the Day of her Marriage which shall first happen. Item I give to Anne of my Servants twelveten pence. Item I give to Anne Damer Wife of Paul Jamer twentie Shillings of lawfull English Money. Item I give and bequeath unto Edmund Hunt my Kinsman whom I make and appoint my Executor of this my last Will and Testament. All my three milch-hymen Bullen horses and all other my Cattle whatsover and Cartes Ploughes and Varnes whatsover. And my Will and desire is that my said Executor shall have the Use of all my Household stuffe during all the time as hee shall remaine unmarried, But if hee shall happen to be married, Then I doe will that all my said Household stuffe shall be and be divided amongst them; And I doe desire my Kinsmen Henry Hunt and Laurence Hunt of Ham to be my Overseers of this my last Will and Testament.
