 William Scott and share alike payable to them respectively upon their attaining
 their respective ages of twenty one years And whereas bequest of my said children have
 not attained their age of twenty one years I do hereby direct and make intent
 and meaning of this my Will is that the portions of such of my said children as
 have not attained their ages of twenty one years shall be placed out at interest on
 account or real securities in the discretion of my Executors to be called
 and the yearly produce thereof shall be paid to said children my said wife during
 their respective minorities for the board clothing and education of my said children or
 some other person as may be appointed in case of the death of my wife before the
 youngest child shall have attained the age of Twenty one years And as to all other
 my personal estate and effects of what nature or kind soever I give bequest and
