Rogers before his death and before his death to the time of  
the said deceased and with his manner and character of transacting and  
disposing of his affairs and also wrote and subscribed  
his name and having done with care and attention recited and  
inscribed the following writing thereon according purporting to be and  
contain the last will and testament of the said Dr. Maurice Rogers beginning thus  
"I Dr. Maurice Rogers residing at Castle Street in the Parish of St. Edmund  
in the City of Hereford" ending thus "In witness whereof I have signed  
and sealed this day of January A.D. 1835 and having  
written before the same Dr. Maurice Rogers on the 12<sup>th</sup> instant  
and again before the same but without the  
signature of any witness thereto and having afterwards written  
the words "Witness" written over the word "law" in the thirtieth line  
of the first side of the said will and the word "first witness and" so  
written between the ninth and tenth line of the second side thereof  
then Dr. Maurice Rogers said "I do will also in this instrument  
between myself and my wife Elizabeth my executors of this will in a

Elizabeth and the said witness written at the conclusion hereof  
and the said witness so interlined in the said will to be all of

PROVE taken on the 6<sup>th</sup> March 1835 before me Justice of the Peace  
of the County of Devon before the Justices of the Peace elected to return a Return  
of the Grand Jury having been first sworn by them to tell the Truth.

This is the last Will and Testament of me James Smith of Tickton in the County of Yorks Labourer first written  
that all my just debts funeral and testamentary charges and  
expenses be paid and provided by the executors of my will  
I give all my household goods furniture and other effects to be  
equally divided between my two children our daughters Elizabeth  
Sister and Margaret to be equally divided between them & their  
share alike I give and devise all that new built cottage or  
tenement garden and the lands situate and being at Tickton in

the County of Norfolk and more in this my other instrument unto Joseph Ballards of Writtle in the County of Essex Esquire Merchant and a George Smith of Bishop's Stortford Labourer to witness the said Joseph Ballards and George Smith and the survivor of them and this my instrument to sell and dispose of the same either by sealed will or by wills and the monies arising by sale of the same towards my intent to be equally divided between me amongst them the said sum of £1000 being the sum of the said Joseph Ballards estate towards of William Jacobus Elizabeth Smith a married widow and John Smith her son deceased and his wife Mary and three children and I witness before you that the receipt of the said Joseph Ballards and George Smith and the survivor of them and this my shall be a good and sufficient discharge to the survivor of the said cottage garden and gardens thereunto directed to be sold as aforesaid and such survivor shall not be obliged to see to the application of the proceeds thereof or be answerable or accountable for the same and lastly I do hereby appoint the said Joseph Ballards and George Smith joint Executor of this my will and then revoke all other wills by me made in witness whereof I have signed and sealed this and seal this present first day of February 1835 The mark of James Smith witness sealed publickly and declared by the said James Smith the testator as and for his last will and a testament in the presence of us two in the presence at the request in the presence of each other two witnesses subscribed and witnessed by George Hopkins — William Paddick —
