Commend my Soul into the hands of Almighty God hoping thus
to escape death and Passion of my Saviour Jesus Christ to re-
ceiveth Pardon of my Sins and to beseeche Eternal life And my
Body I Commit to the Grounds to be decently buried in the said
Churchyard at the Discretion of my Executors hereinafter named
such as touching such Temporal Estate as it shall please God
to bestow upon me I dispose of as followeth And first my one
Will is that my Debts and funeral Expenses be paid and then
discharged and this my last Will will performed and fulfilled
Item I do give and bequeath unto my loving Wife Judith my
Seasold Bargain we now enjoy during her natural life and
after her Decease I do give the said Seasold Bargain to my
son William Watts likewise give unto my said Wife Judith all
my outdoor Stock of what kind soever as Corn in my Barn or on
my Ground likewise my Cattle of what sort soever and likewise
send unto my said Wife all my Judgment Goods during her life
Moreover I do give unto my said Wife Judith the summe of
forty pounds of good and Lawfull money to be paid to her in
six months after my Decease Item I do give unto my son
Thomas Watts the sume offorty pounds to be paid to him
at the end of One year after my Decease likewise give unto
my son Thomas my Augerous in the Skittles after his decease
of his Brother in Saw I likewise give unto my said son Thomas
my best Coat Waistcoat and breeches Item I do give unto my
son Joseph Watts that Dwelling house he now liveth in with all
furniture belonging and moreover I do give unto my said son
Joseph the sume of thirty five pounds to be paid him at the
end of One year after my Decease Item I give unto my son
John Watts my Great Oak Chest in my Chamber over my
Skittles after his Decease of his Brother in Saw Item I do
give and bequeath unto my son William Watts my Cabinet in
my Skittles and my furnace after the decease of his an-

Alrofher And furthermore if there shall be any money lost
of mylatis Owing to me that my four Sons shall have every
one an equal share and furthermore my Will is that all
my Indoor Goods after the Decrease of my wife Judith Except
that before given shall be parted equally between my four
sons All the rest of my Goods or Almoneys not before given
I do give and bequeath unto my Son John Watts and to my
Son William Watts making them Bouynt Executors of this my
last Will and Testament And I do make void all former Wills
by me made and this to be taken for my last
Will and Testament which unto the above named John
Watts Executor do sett my hand and seal this twenty fourth of
February in the Year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred
and hundred and forty two John Watts Signed Sealed and declared
by me the abovenamed John Watts Executor to be my last Will
and Testament in the presence of us whose names are here
subscribed as witness Thomas Bickridge Isaac Philpot
the mark of Henry Bickridge.

and Joseph Piddng and the survivor of them his heirs Executors
Administrators and Assignees for ever In trust and to and for and upon
the several uses intentes and purposes following that is to say
In trust as to such part of my said Premises as I am leid
