the Church of England one thousand six hundred and fifty. I Roger Lichards of L  
Ancton in the County of York, man being weare and infirme of body but of good  
and perfect mentes preuisid the Almighty God for the saue doo hirby declare and  
do last to let vnde all formes wills and testaments by me before made and do make and ordaine  
this my last will and testamant in manner and forme following first I comend my soule unto  
the hand of God my maker hopeing abundantly through the only mercies of Jesus Christ my  
Saviour to be made partake of life everlasting and I comend my body to the earth where it was  
made to bee buried in Christian burial according to the direction of my executrix hereafter named  
and at such tyme and rateing all my land tenements and hereditaments with thire appurtenances  
situall lying and being within the said parish of Juston and County of York which I have  
before purchased from my brother William Lichards I do give and bequeath the same unto  
Eleanore my now wife for and during the termes of her naturall life (during no wile therpon)  
The remainder thereof after the decess of my said wife I do give and bequeath unto my daug-  
hter Elizabeth Martyn the now wife of my sonne in lawe Gabell Martyn for and during the  
termes of the naturall life of her the said Elizabeth (during no wile) And after the death of  
either of my said wife and daughter I give and bequeath all my said lands tenements and  
hereditaments with thire appurtenances unto my grandchild Gabell Martyn (eldest sonne  
of my said sonne in lawe Gabell Martyn) and to the heire male of his body lawfully to bee be-  
gotten And for defaule of such issue to Roger Martyn his brother and to the like issue male of  
his body lawfully to bee begotten And for defaule of such issue to Lettice Martyn my grandchild  
third daughter and to her heires and assignes for ever prohibited alwaies and my will purring  
is that in case my said daughter Elizabeth Martyn and Gabell Martyn her husbande  
or either of them shall att any tyme hereafter alayn by game or sell or otherwise doe away  
or dispose of the estate or inheritance given and bequeathed unto her in my said lands  
and tenements or any part or partes thereof (unless it bee to let the same from yeare to  
yeare only at an yearly Rent) That then the estate and inheritance hereby given and bequeathed  
unto her the said Elizabeth in the said lands tenements and hereditaments with thire appur-  
tenances shall bee thirely paid and of none effect And that then and in such case my will and  
intentacion is that imediately after the decess of the said Eleanore my wife the said lands ten-  
ements and hereditaments with thire appurtenances shall dispende remaine and come unto  
my said grandchildren or one of them in manner and forme heres before specified to be  
any thing herin to the contrary notwithstanding ffor I do hereby further give and bequeath  
unto my said Grandchild Gabell Martyn fiftie pounds of lawfull mony of England And  
to his brother Roger Martyn beforenamed thirtie pounds of like lawfull mony of England And  
to the said Lettice heresister twenty pounds of like lawfull englysh mony of the whiche eadie  
severall summes of money my will is shall bee paid by my executrix within one yeare next  
after my decess unto the halfe of my deceasest heires after named to bee by thre parts out  
of disposed of to and for the best use and benefit of my said grandchildren (that is to say) of the  
said severall summes hereby given and bequeathed unto the said Gabell and Roger per hill-  
such tyme as they shall severally and proportionally attaine to the age of one and two ouer  
yeare aptte due of the same given and bequeathed to my said grandchild Lettice Martyn  
theris sister until such tyme as she shall attaine to the age of sixteen yeare or bee married  
whiche shall first happen At which tyme severall age my will and intencion is that my said  
executrix shall pay the same to my said Grandchildren or their assignes severally and  
proportionally with the uses and benefit that shall bee in the same tyme thereof made  
All the rest of my goods all chattells moveable and unmoveable debts plate ready mony

about written was provided at London before the right w<sup>t</sup> Mr Nathaniel Gristle leight doctor of the lawe and Judge of the Exchequer Court the 21<sup>st</sup> day of May in the yere of our Lord God one thousand five hundred and fiftie one by the oath of Eleanor Piersant the Testit and Executrix therin named to whom administration by all and singular the goods debts and chattells of the said testator which may any time hereafter be required to be sold and accounted, the being first legally sworn by oaths of a coroner in that he be left legally to aduise of the same.

twelfth day of March anno 1650 I John Murphy Roads of Barlaston in the County of Stafford yoman being sick in body but of perfect memory praise be to God I do make this my last will and testamant in manner and forme following vizt firste and principally I command my soule into the hands of Almighty God my testator who gave it me & clad my body to be buried according to the direction of my Executor hereafter named at the parish church of Weston Camble in the said County of Stafford or else for my worldly goods which the lord hath sent me to this intent there shall bee no strife for the same after my decease if dispossess of them as followeth I will give and bequeath unto William Carter my first sonne the profit of two lands or butto one in the place called the other with the whate field or to be found with p[er]ce the other with barley and one other in the fallow field the two first lands for this to my only the other the same for the next C[on]t[in]ue if so longe live of I g[ro]und and bequeath to him and feare Carter my said eldest daughter each of them the summe of three shillings to be paid equally be twise thre shillings & groat and bequeath unto William Hobson to my servant man the sume of two shillings And to Mary Bird my servant the sume of thre shillings further give to William Carter aforesaid all my widdowes apparel after my decease which shal bequeath unto him & shall haue the ringe which shall yenge for ever the sume of thre shillings my will and mind is that the three children of Joane Youson of Whitton in the said County of Stafford shall haue the sume of thre shillings equally to bee devided betwix them Out of this my last will & testamant or dancis and appoint my lording friend William yearly the sume of 200 soulds of the land of Barlaston aforesaid my son and sole Executor of this my last will and testamant not doubting but he will performe the tenents proposed in him according to the my mind and intent And also of further intent William Myott the elder of Barlaston and Lawrence 8 pounds of Barlaston aforesaid to bee oborsed of this my last will and to beوارد and affixing unto my said Executor herein to see the same truly performed And I do hereby rebafe all former and other wills by me heretofore made perhat so done in witness whereof I have set my hand and seal the day and yere first above written Th: murphy of Bumphey Roads sealed signed, read and published to be the last will and testamant of the said John Murphy Roads in the presence of Lawrence Hobson the wifes of Richard Taylor Zachariah Hobson and others off.
